

Readme File:

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The basic design is as follows:

- Introduction consisting of the historical setting for the original work and the people involved.
- The Ten Commandments
- The Creeds
- Etc.

The learning package consists of two PowerPoint Presentations for the Visual Learner's Small Catechism. An additional file is provided for further catechesis work and augmentation of the Word and Sacraments section of the SC. If they are slides you want to save until later just hide them before using the file. Also included is a pdf file for printout of the student workbooks having the same information, plus note taking space. It is recommended that arrangements be made to have the student workbooks spiral bound on the left side so they will lay flat.

Presentation text includes multiple embedded links to online resources that would provide Scripture references, plus additional information and classical art to provide context for the student.

Instructor, here are some options to using the material on the disk.

1. For one on one instruction (or up to three or four) you can present the materials projected on a large monitor (such as a large TV monitor). Each student would have their own workbook.
2. For a larger group of students projecting the materials on a large screen using a video projector would be in order. Each student would have their own workbook
3. In either options 1 or 2 you have some students use laptops with the show files loaded and they could keep in step with the instructor (may be an issue for the inquisitive mind to speed ahead and not hear your speech accompanying a particular slide). A better approach, if you the technical capability, would be to broadcast the show file over your local network and have the students pick that up on their laptops.

Presentation Options:

1. The first option is the order of presentations. You could start with How Art Teaches Theology first (my recommendation) and follow that with the Small Catechism. or
2. The second option is to lead with the Small Catechism and then follow that with How Art Teaches Theology.
3. If your students have laptops you can load the show file and they can proceed in step with your timing. In this way the student presentation will be in color. Additionally, if you have local network access they can access the links when you do.
